Sites for digitized copies of MTA's periodicals

All of MTA's publications from 1848-1976 that have been digitized are in a searchable collection on this website organized by a non-profit called HathiTrust.

You can also find these publications in chronological order on the individual pages based on the university where the original documents were held and digitized. There is a complete run from 1848-1874. From 1875-1914 the MTA didn't have its own publication, but instead contributed to the New England Journal of Education/Journal of Education. There is a nearly complete run from 1914-1976, published under the name the Massachusetts Teachers Federation and then the MTA again starting in 1953. Missing from that period are Vols. 6 and 7 (1926 and 1927); issue #5 from Vol. 36 (1957), #7 from Vol. 37 (1958); and all issues except #3 and #4 from Vol. 40 (1960-1961). The MTA has posted digital copies of MTA Today on its website from 2014 to present.
